Pride of Herndon HHS Bands History

The Herndon High School Band has been a part of Northern Virginia since 1947. The oldest established high school band in Fairfax County had its genesis when dedicated parents and citizens convinced Vladamir Johnson, a Russian interpreter and part -time music teacher from Washington, D.C., to rehearse a group of fledgling musicians in the rural town of Herndon.

The same program served as an inspiration and model for the instrumental music groups later formed in Fairfax County schools. Today, these program expose thousands of young people to the unique enjoyment of making music together and participating in concerts, festivals and competitions of various categories at the county, state and national level.

Today, Herndon Virginia is a thriving suburb of Washington, D.C. The band program at Herndon High School has mirrored the growth of the town, increasing from that original group of fifteen musicians to more than 150 instrumentalists comprising the following ensembles: Marching Band, Wind Ensemble, Symphonic Band, Jazz Band, and Indoor Drumline, under the direction of Mrs Kathleen Jacoby.

Honor Band

A band receives the Honor Band designation when they receive a superior rating at VBODA Marching Band Assessment and the Wind Ensemble Band Assessment.
