
"Now it's your turn to set a new standard."

2015 Marching Show will Rock the Pride

At the senior awards banquet on June 8, Director Kathleen Jacoby introduced next year's marching show and a contest to come up with its name and t-shirt design. The show will encompass storms and sun, and music from the sixties and seventies, including music from The Beatles, and a powerful sequence featuring the percussion section.



According to Jacoby, the show takes months to develop. She and Bob Thurston start early second semester brainstorming ideas for song titles with, as she puts it, "a pretty epic email chain of video song links, musical puns, and visual ideas."

As the progress continues, Drill Designer John Merz comes on board to work with the Guard and "develop a visual package." Once specific student numbers are determined in June, Merz will begin to notate specific drill spots before camp in August.

"He's been our Drill Designer for 10 years now," Jacoby said, "so he knows our style."

And it will, to be sure, be a "good day sunshine" for the band members as they begin their practice two months from now.

Marching Band Camp and Information

For students familiar with marching band, August means fun in the heat with practices, sprit days, and team building. "Rookie Camp," which is for all new members to the HHS Marching Band Program, will begin on August 10. Leadership will also be present to guide new members in learning the routines of the Pride's program.

Then, on the week of August 17, the entire band returns to begin learning this year's show. According to director Kathleen Jacoby, all instructional staff will return in August and are enthusiastic about helping students with this year's show. She did say that, in addition to seeing more of Ms. Bonneau, students can expect to see, "The cutest eight month old in the world to be crawling around."

Herndon HS Sends Student to NAfME

HowDee, Minnie! Herndon High School will be sending one of its own to the Grand Ole Opry.

James Adams, a freshman percussionist in the HHS Wind Ensemble, has been chosen for the All-National Honors Concert Band, sponsored by the National Association for Music Educators. He will perform at the historic venue in Nashville, Tennessee on

October 28th

"James has been preparing for this experience his entire life. He has taken advantage of every musical opportunity that has come his way. He's got an incredible track record of hard work, service, and leadership," said director Kathleen Jacoby.

Adams was one of 150 instrumentalists chosen from a field of 2.5 million students nationwide. Auditions were open to All-State Band participants and involved the submission of recordings and recommendations. Adams expressed great enthusiasm about participating in an ensemble with such high caliber musicians.

"I'm really looking forward to meeting different All-State level musicians from around the country and performing with them. The conductors are all really good and nationally known, so I hope to learn a lot from them," Adams said.

He was also appreciative of the support he received from his band director during the application process.

"Ms. Jacoby so kindly wrote a letter of recommendation supporting me. Her letter was very crucial in the process and helped the Honor Band staff to know more about me."

Adams will spend three days in Nashville before performing for a select group of music teachers from across the nation. He pointed out that, as in All-State Band, the ensemble will have two days to rehearse together, playing music they have not previously performed.

"I hope to contribute all my skills as a percussionist to the group and help them sound as good as possible. I also want to represent my percussion section, my town, and my state well."

The concert on Wednesday afternoon at the Grand Ole Opry will also include a jazz ensemble of 20 students and a vocal choir of approximately 350.

Adams is the first Herndon High School student to be chosen for this honor in the school's history, and his director Jacoby expressed great pride in his accomplishment, and his attitude.

"We couldn't ask for a nicer or more humble member of the Herndon Band program. He's going to bring back a wealth of knowledge from this experience, and I'm excited about what ideas he'll have for our program when he returns."
